The Stroke Support Service provides:

- Practical information, support and advice for people who have had a stroke, their families and carers.
- Re-ablement support for people looking to access community activities

The Service can offer:

- Physical and emotional support for survivors and their families/carers.
- Information to help people understand the effects of stroke and outline possible treatments.
- Advocacy support and advice on how to get help from Health Services, Social Services, Voluntary Organisations, Groups and Stroke Clubs.
- Help prevent further strokes by advising on healthier lifestyle choices.
- Re-ablement support.

We provide a series of workshops throughout the year.
